A large crowd came out to the Italian Culural Centre on February 26 to listen to heritage activist and community historian Laura Saimoto's presentation on the Rupert-Renfrew neighbourhood of East Vancouver.

She discussed the heritage gems of the neighbourhood including the lost streams that feed into the Still Creek and Burnaby Lake watershed; the return of servicement to Renfrew Heights in the 1940s to a housing development referred to by its residents as "The Projects." Several of those who grew up in these 'projects' attended the talk and contributed their memories.



RISE Community Health Centre (CHC) in Vancouver is a primary care clinic offering services akin to family doctors and nurse practitioners. But what they offer is much more – and is grounded in a commitment to improve the health and well-being of people with chronic illness and disability. RISE (Resilient, Integrative, Socially Just and Equitable) offers teambased care to local residents with supports available for medical and social needs.

RISE Community Health Centre is a part of Collingwood Neighbourhood house. What sets RISE CHC apart is its focus on holistic health care, covering physical, social, and emotional well-being. In addition to general health concerns, they address the social determinants of health, mild to moderate mental health conditions, addictions, and the coordination of specialized care. Beyond the clinic, RISE extends services to the Renfrew-Collingwood neighbourhood, providing health promotion, harm reduction, and pharmacy services.

Their commitment extends further through outreach initiatives. RISE CHC provides outreach twice a month in low-income housing buildings: Kingsway Continental, Naomi Place, and Sarah Ross. They also provide weekly outreach to the Morning Star breakfast and shower program for people experiencing homelessness. The team includes nurse practitioners, family physicians, community health workers, and licensed practical nurses, and is supported by medical office assistants, social workers, counsellors, physiotherapists, occupational therapists, pharmacists, registered nurses and dietitians.

They serve people with disabilities, mental health and substance use disorders, who are low-income earning, and people previously experiencing homelessness or at risk. For many, says nurse practitioner Sonja Rietkerk, outreach is the only opportunity that many RISE clients have for accessing primary care.

"Providing outreach services is an integral way for our RISE CHC team to pursue and honour our CHC's values of being: Resilient, Integrative, Socially Just, Equitable," says Sonja. "Getting out of the clinic and connecting with people living in the Renfrew-Collingwood neighbourhood has been a meaningful way to meet people where they are at and to include them into our circle of care."

The challenges of the population RISE serves are multi-faceted. Many struggle to visit due to chronic illness, disability, transportation issues, complex health care relationships, fear, difficulty seeking care, and limited access to resources.

Chronic illnesses and disabilities vary among RISE CHC's community members. Mental health conditions such as anxiety, depression, bipolar disorder, post-traumatic stress disorder, and schizophrenia are common. Other chronic conditions include chronic obstructive pulmonary disease, asthma, obesity, heart and kidney diseases, Alzheimer's, dementia, substance, and alcohol use disorders. They also encounter people with neurodevelopmental disorders such as attention-deficit/hyperactivity disorder and autism spectrum disorder, and physical disabilities like arthritis and brain injuries.

RISE CHC's outreach services address these issues. Community members seek care and support during their outreach, some becoming ongoing clients. Their approach prioritizes safety and comfort, benefiting those with complex health care relationships and negative past experiences. Visiting residents' suites enhances accessibility for those homebound or with mobility challenges.





The outreach program includes medication reviews and adjustments, involving coordinated efforts between RISE CHC, pharmacies, and external agencies. These efforts underscore their commitment to improving the health and well-being of those with chronic illness and disability.

"Participating in our outreach initiatives has given so much meaning that permeates through my work experience," says Mark Rito, a community health worker. "Being able to provide support to clients on outreach and enhance their access to connections to community and care has been a wonderful opportunity – and we hope to continue and strengthen our ability to do so."

Health Quality BC provides system-wide leadership to efforts designed to improve the quality of health care in British Columbia. Through collaborative partnerships with health authorities, patients, and those working within the health care system, we promote and inform a provincially-coordinated, patient-centred approach to quality.

Collingwood Corner: Demolishing of Vancouver Distribution Centres LTD, formerly McGregor Warehouses at 3450 **Wellington Avenue**

Do you remember a train whistle blowing late at night in the 1960s and 1970s when the freight train would arrive at the back of the large warehouse complex located on Wellington Avenue train used the former interurban tracks from the east. I lived on Monmouth Avenue and the sound would comfort me in the middle of the night.

The warehouse was opened in March 1957 at 3450 Wellington Avenue and owned by Robert K Arkley. For many years it was **McGregor Warehouses** LTD, until it came under new management in 1973 and was changed to Vancouver **Distribution Centres** LTD. The owner at the time was George

A Carey, and the general manager was Harvey Allen. The warehouses were a huge facility consisting of 120,000 square feet. Some of the businesses located here were Castrol Oils, Nestle Canada LTD, DuBois Chemicals of Canada LTD, and Johnsons Wax.

It was difficult gleaning this information from online newspapers at Newspapers.com. Not much has been written about this complex which was in the Collingwood neighbourhood from 1957 until 1992, a period of 35 years, when it was demolished to make way for townhomes and condos. The area was rezoned in 1988.

The warehouses were torn down in 1992. The apartments and townhomes were sold from 1992 to 1994, advertised in the Vancouver Sun newspaper for as low as \$4,000 down payment. Apartments started at \$74,500 and townhomes started at \$210,000, from VLC



> Properties. Eventually, the area included Wellington townhomes on Wellington Avenue, with the Avalon and Connaught townhomes behind them. Also included were two high rise towers, the tallest in the neighborhood at the time: the Regent Court and Queen's Court.

My dad, John Williams, took the two photos included with this article. I inherited my love of old buildings and documenting neighbourhood changes from him. These are the only two photos I have seen of the warehouses on Wellington. The one thing I remember about this area is the beautiful green lawn in the front, with picnic tables for the staff. McGreer Street was once an unnamed gravel lane, running along the West side of the property. Do you have memories or photos of this warehouse complex? 




"Both Ann and Jo-Ann were concerned for those that were less fortunate and wanted to be able to assist them in realizing their goals in life. They were also both lifelong learners who placed a huge value on education," says scholarship fund advisor and family friend Paula Carr. Carr notes that when researching information for the award, the advisors found that there was a gap in career development support for older refugees.

"Often, the first priority of refugee settlement is getting established, finding housing, and finding work. Once the basics have been attained, they begin to think of broader career development, and often this is after they are 25."

Sanjeev Karwal



When Sanjeev Karwal was a child, on weekends he would push his bike across Euclid Street to join his friends as they played on the warehouse ramps in the light industrial space. A few years later, the space had been cleared and he attended the ground-breaking ceremony for Collingwood Neighbourhood House's (CNH) main site

In 1995, when CNH opened its new site, Sanjeev, his brother and friends started playing basketball at CNH. For Sanjeev, the visits evolved throughout high school into opportunities to attend other programs

and then volunteer, notably with the Youth Centre and the after-school Buddy Program. Twenty years ago he was hired as a youth worker at the Youth Centre and now serves a dual role in Youth Services as a manager and as a director.

"I really appreciate the journey I have had at CNH," Sanjeev said. "I've been able to learn, develop and grow with the organization. I've also had the opportunity to lead and be part of so many meaningful and rewarding projects, where I've been able to be creative and use a variety of skills and assets."




