

The Craft of Spirit BC Liturgical Textile

through to March 31, 2024 at the Italian Cultural Centre's II Museo Gallery

From a popular culture perspective, the world of textile art is synonymous with the realm of rock star designers who reign supreme at the helm of major fashion houses. These institutions with their massive advertising budgets and commercial infrastructures thrive off of shock value and ostentatious display. The current exhibition at the Italian cultural centre (*Il Museo Gallery*), in contrast, seeks to remove our current notions of textile art as residing in the zone of celebrity culture and aims to return it to its rightful place as an art form intended for spiritual practice and ritual.

Historically, textile art has always been a metaphor for the human desire to connect with the Divine. The innate qualities of textile being malleable, diaphanous, opaque, enveloping the body, as well as its capacity to be lifted by the wind, like a curtain, make it a perfect symbol for human encounters with the mystical world. In fact, the veil, a word which innately conjures up references to fabric and textile, is a common expression for the liminal; that momentary space between two worlds (heaven and earth, life and death, the known and unknown).

Even before recorded time, textile was a constant presence in ritual. Whether it was an animal skin worn in a traditional dance preparing for the hunt or Jesus healing the lepers from the hem of his garment, textile had had a significant role to play, serving as a catalyst for acts of spiritual and physical transformations. The exhibition at the Italian Cultural Gallery entitled The Craft of Spirit: BC Liturgical Textiles focuses on ritual textiles worn and created in Vancouver. To represent the history of liturgical textile in this city, the gallery is





separated into two rooms.

Room one

Room one is devoted to textile vestments from Anglican and Catholic religious traditions (1924 to 2024). This space reveals how the city's immigrant culture consistently looked back to the old country for its spiritual reference points. Robes bearing ancient Roman names such as chausable (poncho), cope (cape) and tunical (overdress) reveal that religious design concepts had their origins in Roman antiquity. Also, these pieces were the handiwork of unknown makers whose spiritual devotion outweighed their need for notoriety. Yet, in their anonymity, they created undisputed masterpieces, especially in the art of embroidery.

In this exhibition one can witness how history conspired to honour these high achievements. Carefully preserving these immaculate patches of embroidery, they were lovingly transferred many times over onto newer vestments. This merging of old embroidery with new garments serves as a study in contrasts, like an old master painting inserted into a new frame.

There are also contemporary vestments made by active BC textile artists such as Thomas Roach, Judy Villett and Jean Kares. These pieces are also marvels of artistic achievement, revealing how far contemporary spirituality has removed itself from impersonal traditional symbology. Instead, the identity of the wearer, artist, and even local geography are continuous reference points and deeply integrated into the design concepts. No longer are these vestments serving as an umbilical cord to the old country, rather references to the natural life of BC and personalized spiritual journeys are invoked in these immaculately crafted vestments.

Room two

Room two is devoted to the category of textile corresponding to the often-invoked category of "spiritual but not religious." This space includes textile art with references to Eastern philosophies such as the of the ancient text the Tao te Ching, maps of sacred territories such as Iona, Scotland; the home of the 6th century Celtic monks, and images of birds in flight. Birds, being symbols in both Christian and pagan spiritualities, which convey the body being shed and the soul taking



A PORTION OF THE RAPIDLY GROWING BUSINESS SECTION OF COLLINGWOOD



Several new business blocks have been erected in the Collingwood district during the past year. In the above engraving, which was taken from the B. C. E. R. tracks of the interurban line, at East Collingwood, looking along Joyce Street to Westminster Road, the two corner blocks were built during the past summer, and have only recently been occupied. Unless you are a hermit, you must admit that the area at Joyce and Vanness is changing dramatically. In December 2023, the Community Savings Credit Union closed, after 22 years. (they merged with the branch on Commercial Drive)

This has always been a thriving corner because of the BCER interurban track, built in 1891 to connect downtown Vancouver to New Westminster. Today the Skytrain runs along the same route, built in 1985. The Joyce Collingwood station was enlarged recently on the east side of Joyce, and it's a very busy corner.

Back in the early 1900s, two large office buildings were built on the SE corner of Joyce and Vanness and across Joyce on the SW corner. Recently I discovered photos from 1974 in the Vancouver archives, which show the two buildings 60 years later. I realized that I would have passed by them frequently as a young girl, but I have no recollection of them at all. Do you remember these two buildings?





Vancouver Weather

Everyone knows it rains a lot in Vancouver. There are many different words for rain like drizzle, showers and storms. A drizzle is a small amount of rain. Some people like walking in a drizzle because the air smells so clean. A shower is a medium amount of rain. Flowers in the spring love showers to grow. A storm is a lot of rain. A lot of snow is also called a storm. No one likes driving in storms because the roads are slippery, which means it is hard to drive in a straight line because the roads feel smooth.

During the fall, winter and spring, it is helpful to check the weather forecast online or on the radio. A weather forecast gives you information about the weather for one day or the whole week. That way, you will know if you need an umbrella to stay dry if you have to wait for a bus. Vancouver usually gets drizzle or showers but, in the last few years, storms happen more often. Homes and streets get flooded during storms because rivers overflow. It is important to clear any drains or gutters around your home so that water doesn't get trapped and cause floods or leaks.

Weather patterns are changing worldwide. Vancouver is getting more atmospheric rivers, which are long periods of heavy rain or snow. Atmospheric rivers don't only cause flooding but they disrupt travel, ruin roads and result in serious car accidents. It is a good idea to pack an emergency kit in your car with blankets, flashlights and battery-operated chargers for your phone.



Thomas Wong: 25 years of 'extraordinary compassion' at CNH







erences to Eastern philosophies such as the of the ancient text the Tao te Ching, maps of sacred territories such as Iona, Scotland; the home of the 6th century Celtic monks, and images of birds in flight. Birds, being symbols in both Christian and pagan spiritualities, which convey the body being shed and the soul taking flight.

The exhibition culminates with the most recent liturgical textile practices, knitting and quilting prayer circles. Knitted shawls are created as an act of meditation and spiritual practice. Each piece is infused with silent prayers offered by the maker to the recipient with the express hope that it will give comfort to a patient with a terminal illness. Each piece is a gift, a bestowal of blessings, with the intent of giving comfort to the wearer on their healing journey.
